Libraries

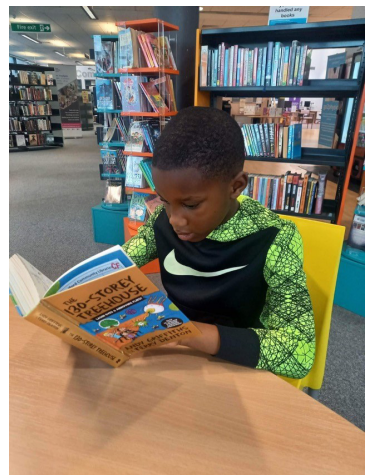
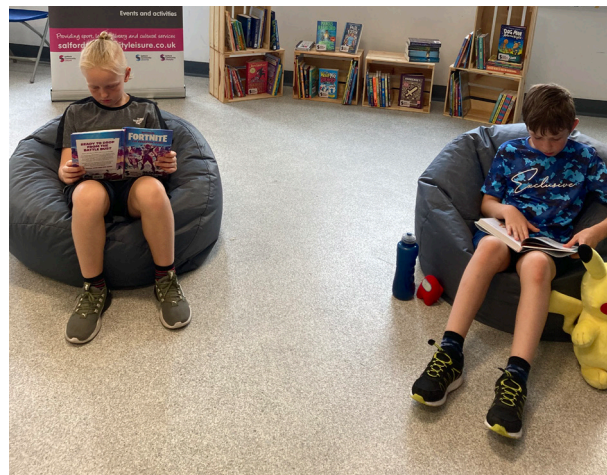
Salford's libraries are fantastic places for people of all ages to read, learn, work and socialise. We have 16 libraries across the city that are safe, welcoming and FREE to use.

Free and low cost activities available in our libraries include:

- Free loan of paper books, e-books and e-audio books, with no charges for late returns
- Free or low cost term-time and school holiday activities such as storytimes and crafts
- Free children's areas, toys, colouring sheets etc
- Free home delivery of books (books@home) for customers whose health or disability makes it difficult to access library buildings
- Free access to electronic resources such as e-magazines, Ancestry, Which, Encyclopaedia Britannica and Driving Theory Test Pro

- FREE Wi-Fi and FREE access to PCs and children's iPads.
- Free expert guidance and essential resources for small businesses and people interested in starting a business.
- Free information and access to expert advice from other agencies
- Free day-to-day digital support and IT courses
- Free scanning of documents
- Free printing of essential documents for refugees and asylum seekers
- Free use of warm space for working, studying, reading, playing, meeting people or just spending time

Museums and Galleries

SCL manages and operates Ordsall Hall and Salford Museum & Art Gallery. Both sites provide people across the city with access to free or low cost cultural and educational experiences.

Ordsall Hall

Records of Ordsall Hall date all the way back to 1117, however, the most important period of its life is undoubtedly as the family seat of the Radclyffe family who resided there for over 300 of those years.

Today, Ordsall Hall celebrates its Tudor heritage providing tours and activities for young and old, bringing its wonderful history to life for all that visit.

You can wander the Hall or its beautiful gardens for free and there are regular craft based activities available for low costs.

Children & Young People's Activities

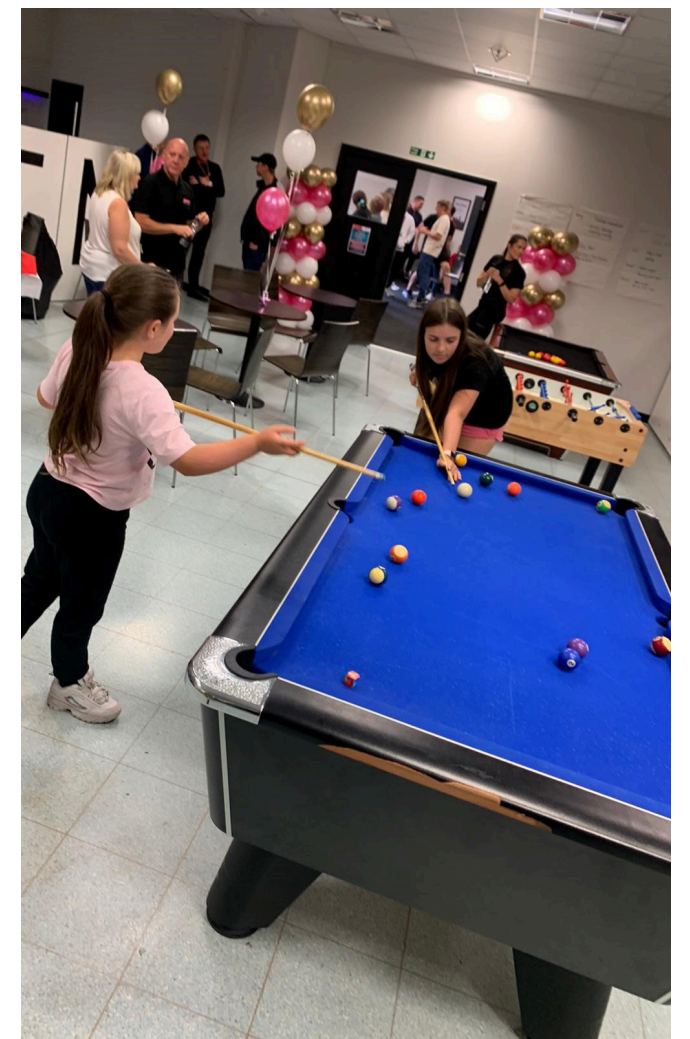
SCL has a team of specialist trained staff that offer a range of activities for children and young people in a variety of venues across the city.
